The ordinance says "effective date" however, it should be "execution date"... sometimes departments back date the effective date even though it was executed by the Clerk afterwards. Could you, by City Attorney Opinion, add clarification that the date after which the CM must provide

notice to the Commission be within 7 days of having the contract "fully executed"...? Let me know if that would be ok.

As for the one item that was fully executed yesterday, Celeste is adding a column to the memo that provides for the execution date (because the effective date was back in August)... at least this way it should be clear to the Commission that the contract was signed yesterday and they will be notified today....
