RE: Legal Opinion Regarding Financial Statements Submitted by Bidders

Date: December 13, 2017

You have inquired whether financial statements submitted by bidders are exempt from disclosure under Florida's Public Records Law. The general rule is that financial statements submitted by bidders are public records that are subject to disclosure. However, Florida Statutes s. 119.071(1)(c) provides that "[a]ny financial statement that an agency requires a prospective bidder to submit in order to prequalify for bidding or for responding to a proposal for a road or any other public works project is exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution." (emphasis added). "Public works" is not defined by statute. Thus, any question regarding whether a particular project constitutes a "public works project" should be referred to this office for a factual determination to be made on a case-by-case basis as to whether the exemption applies.

This opinion is issued pursuant to section 2-252(e)(1) and (8) of the City Code.
